ITEM 3 – Receipt and Adoption of the 2021/22 Annual Report and Financial Statements

3.1 Adoption of the 2021/22 Annual Report and Financial Statement

3.2 The President presented the Annual Report, asked the meeting if there were any questions to any Directors. Dan commenced by saying that the club had had another outstanding year.

3.3 Financial Report – Hayden spoke to the financial report.

The Club had a solid year of income growth as was the cost of doing business for the Club. We achieved an operating loss of \$4816

Most revenue streams grew in comparison to the previous season by 16%

- Membership grew 5%
- Grants dramatically increased by 64% due to the club's continued investment in employment
- Cash position increased 4%
- increase in commercial revenue from food, bar and merchandise by 18%
- increase in venue hire by 13%.
- Carnival hosting increased by 73%

Expenditure also increased by 28%

- Employment cost increased 42% as we added to our workforce with fulltime employment of our Engagement, Marketing and Fundraising Officer and an increase in bar contractors due to increase in venue hire functions
- We invested and celebrated our SLSA 2021 Club of the Year Award with multiple celebrations and merchandise to the cost of \$11,500
- The Powering Communities Program grant enabled significant investment totalling \$14,500 including a grant funded amount of \$8,700 to provide Trigg Island SLSC a solar solution, the benefits will be measured with savings in future power costs from the solar production.
- Cleaning costs doubled to \$8,800 as we ensured the club maintained the Government mandated COVID cleaning requirements of community clubs, access areas and the gym.
- Security costs almost doubled to \$2,200 as we ensured the Government ServiceWA vaccine check requirements were administered.

A huge thanks.

Speaking Aussies, we have never done better with the Youth starting us off on the first weekend with inspirational, breakout performances, followed up by our Masters and then Seniors to round off a top week. Congratulations to all as I know how much dedication and hard work you put in over the whole year. We have finalised the 2023 Financial Year results and it was another successful year of growth financially. The Financial Report ending 30th April 2023 resulted in Trigg Island SLSC reporting a \$49,423 operating profit, however after adding in depreciation a net loss \$34,603.

It was a solid year of income growth and expenses for the club. The club experienced some once off costs and the Board of Directors had approved a conservative budget based on investment in our people. Despite the presence of numerous obstacles, we maintain a positive outlook for continued opportunities in the business of the 2024 season, although accurately predicting its growth is challenging.

Most revenue streams grew in comparison to the previous season, with merchandise +27% to \$50,464, bar and bar venue hire sales +24.7% to \$109,653 and the club's kiosk +10.6% to \$32,556. Unfortunately, we had decline in membership -4.7% to \$172,648 and total grants -17.7% to 136,195. We continue to embark on our ambitious employment program including surf sports whilst developing our community, leadership, and marketing programs. We maintained the required investment in Lifesaving, Surf Sports, Youth and Nippers. We continue to turn our assets and benefit from the patrol vehicle agreement maintaining our original purchase value from almost 4 years ago with a new vehicle provided 6 monthly, albeit 12 monthly due to vehicle shortages.

We are proud to have invested in people and assets, which has resulted in a lift in turnover and the effective management of costs. Hosting the Aussie Titles was a significant milestone for the Club and had a positive impact on our operations and reputation.

TOTAL REVENUE - \$799,007 (FY23) vs \$732,384 (FY22) increase 9.1%.

Where does the money come from and where did we experience decline?

- Total non-commercial income including sponsorship, donations, grants, SLSWA and bank interest \$262,650.
- Total commercial revenue from bar, merchandise, and kiosk +21.8% to \$247,898 with venue hire increasing 13.5% to almost \$35,000.
- Donations also +43.5% to \$28,322, a remarkable result.
- Carnival hosting income increased by 26.9% to \$31,858. This result continues to build a sustainable revenue stream for Trigg Island SLSC.

TOTAL EXPENDITURE – \$676,756 (FY23) vs \$618,071 (FY22) increase 9.5%

Where is the money spent?

- Commercial expenses increased +146.2% to \$49,720 including venue repairs and maintenance with the hall being repainted and cool room repairs in the kitchen contributing \$15,000 to the increase. Our cleaning costs have also increased due to club requirements and no caretaker staying on site.
- Employment costs +31.8% to \$217,152 as we added to our workforce. We also had an increase in bar contractors +19.9% due to increase in venue hire functions.
- Total administration costs reduced slightly -2.6% to \$57,021 and a drop in building and utilities -10.1% to \$53,758.
- Nipper costs increased +56.1% to \$30,125 as we added 15 boards to our rotational board fleet.

Under the season 2022/2023 Lifesaving Service Agreement with the City of Stirling we provided patrols for Trigg Beach from Saturday October 1st 2022 to Sunday March 26th 2023 on weekends and public holidays. This amounted to 113 rostered patrols provided by 16 patrol teams and the voluntary patrol of Christmas day.

Prior to the commencement of patrols, we allocated members to patrol teams as they re-enrolled or gained new qualifications with a view to maintaining consistency for patrol membership balanced against requests based on friendship and family groups. While we were not always to accommodate everyone's requests, on the whole, a balance was achieved. James and Bronwyn put in a lot of time initially to work out teams at the beginning of the season and Jenny Taylor was able to provide insight into the best groupings for new SRC award holders as the education team completed courses through the season.

Patrol Captains

This season we were fortunate in that the majority of patrol captains continued in their roles, which, as a new director provided much needed stability to the lifesaving area. Where existing patrol captains did not continue, their shoes were filled by some more than capable former vice captains and one returning former patrol captain. We are lucky to have a lot of diversity in our patrol leadership group with a spread of ages, gender and experience.

Abalone

This season, in addition to our standard beach patrols, Trigg contributed patrols to each of the four abalone season days. We provided IRBs, Jet skis, land-based patrols, first aid capabilities and coordination in our zone which extended from Trigg Island to north of Bailey Street. Swanbourne Nedlands Surf Club also provided land-based personnel to this zone, extending our capabilities and experience.

Members gained valuable experience operating in and around the reefs to the north of Trigg Island.

John Rhatigan performed the roll of land zone coordinator and recruited members to assist with land-based activities.

Justin Meldrum assembled equipment and operators and crew for the water-based patrols.

SLSWA provided PPE in the form of booties and gloves where required for operations on the reefs and also some throw lines to assist in reef rescues.

The state government pays SLSWA to provide water safety for the season days and Trigg Island SLSC received a share of that based on the resources that we provided.

Largely due to the benign weather conditions, our members were not required to perform any rescues and instead were able to focus on preventative actions and a handful of first aid cases.

Equipment

The new ice maker that was ordered in the previous season was installed in the first aid room by Justin Meldrum. At the same time Justin modified the radio cabinet to accommodate both of the charging stations clearing up the bench space around the sink area of the first aid room.

The radios and charging stations were all serviced at the beginning of the season resolving some of the battery life issues previously reported, but unfortunately creating a chain of issues with volume and then transmission clarity due to a firmware upgrade of the radios. The issues applied to all radios of all clubs in WA that had their radios serviced at that time. SLSWA's supplier Radlink worked on finding appropriate settings to mitigate the issues that were creating sometimes serious communications issues for patrols, with users at times having to make use of mobile phones, highlighting the need for backup communications options. Eventually, with Radlink unable to find a solution SLSWA decided that Radlink should roll the firmware back to the previous version.

ATV

Under the Capital Equipment Support Program enabled by the State Government and Department of Fire and Emergency Services we received a new Can Am Defender HD9 XU ATV right at the end of the patrol season. This new vehicle will be commissioned over the off season with additional rust proofing and bar work and will make one of the existing ATVs available for sale.

Drones

At the time of writing, we have been advised that our new drones will be arriving soon, making Drone Officer Craig Piercy very excited. Two new drone kits have been provided through funding from a Lotterywest grant received by SLSWA. The kits include more powerful aircraft, better camera, screen mirroring, multiple batteries and some spares. Craig is anticipating facilitating training on the new equipment once they have been commissioned.

RWC

A roster operated across the season providing RWC support to the majority of morning patrols and some afternoon patrols. RWCs also operated in water safety roles for carnivals. The loan of an additional craft meant that we were often able to provide multiple RWCs when required, for instance during abalone patrols where we were able to provide 2 RWCs with driver and crew in addition to multiple IRBs.

Patrol Statistics

In the 2022/23 season we provided 113 rostered patrols comprised of members amounting to 6223.11 hours which is on a par with previous years of similar length seasons. An additional 166.25 hours were provided as abalone patrols.

36 rescues were performed this season, up on the previous season's 25 which was unusually low. IRBs performed the majority of rescues at 18 with board and PWCs involved in the majority of the rest.

Combined with low beach attendance of 100,950 this points to a season of difficult conditions which is reflected in high numbers of reported rips and wave activity.

82 first aids were performed, up slightly from last season but including 5 major wounds, mostly to craft operators and included some fairly serious fin chops. Fortunately, there were no drownings, no use of defibrillators and only 3 required ambulances. This points to the competency and timeliness of the rescues performed and water observation.

Stinger injuries were down to 10 reflecting the anecdotal evidence of few stingers this season.

1829 preventative actions were recorded, up from previous years and indicates a lot of positive communication with beachgoers and swimmers.

4 searches for 6 missing persons were carried out this season including one where 2 children were reported missing near the island and later turned up in Scarborough. Apart from those 2, all others were reported found. Later in the season Grant Rosman organised and presented a valuable search and rescue scenario to patrol captains. This valuable session included important insight from WA water police and was well received.

I'd like to take this opportunity to publicly thank everyone who contributed to this season.

Including my immediate team, James, Justin and Dave.

The 2022/2023 surf sports campaign was a long, action-packed season commencing early in the season with what was a highly successful Pool Rescue series of Championships (more about this later!), followed by a significant number of athletes being selected to tour to the Eastern States (for the first time since the COVID lockdown) as part of the Western Suns team for the Interstate Championships and/or the National Super Surf Teams League, building into the Rescue and Beach State Championships being hosted by Trigg Island SLSC in February, the Surf State titles early March and culminating in a very successful Aussies campaign which Trigg Island SLSC jointly hosted with Scarborough SLSC.

Our season kicked off way back in June 2022 when we commenced our winter block of training under the stewardship of our new Head Coach, Andrew Mosel (Moz) and his able assistant coaches. Running, weights, ski and board sessions at Johnson Street and Hillary's Marina were the order of the day with a good turnout seen at most sessions. Saturday mornings at Johnston St were particularly busy with a large number of participants from U15's through to the eager masters contingent. The winter training block finished with an iron-person style race for all the eager athletes with Moz's "killer hill run" sorting out the field. A weekly boxing-fitness circuit class was also initiated at about this time to offer an alternative health and fitness offering to all club members.

At the same time, time our Pool Rescue athletes were doing themselves and the club proud across the State, Australian and World titles. The results that the Pool Rescue team achieved across these three carnivals were exceptional, and in particular those of the two (2) Trigg athletes - Jake Smith and Harrison Hynes – who were selected to represent Australia in Italy as part of the Australian Lifesaving team. In particular, Jake's performance in Pool Rescue this season was the best by any Australian athlete in the history of the sport. At the World Championships, Jake won five (5) Gold, two (2) silver and two (2) Bronze medals. Harrison's medal haul was not far behind with three (3) Gold, two (2) silver and one (1) Bronze medals. Together, they played a lead role in Australia winning a very memorable World Championships.

Once again, we had a great team presence in Broome for the annual Broome Carnival. This annual event continues to go from strength to strength with Trigg always well represented with athletes of all levels, and their families and supporters, enjoying their annual winter escape to the north of our state.

This year we kicked off the surf sports season with a 'requal' weekend in Lancelin. This was a great team bonding weekend with ~65 athletes put through their paces by our great team of Trigg Island assessors who helped make the weekend a reality. Other team bonding activities throughout the season organised by Toddy Brewer, ably supported by his 'partner in crime', Matt Bowbridge, included a bowls evening, the Secret Harbour pub-crawl and the infamous 'Mad Monday' festivities.

The season proper commenced in October with the Endurance Championships and a number of other races including the WA ironman series and SunSmart Surf Carnival. These races were used as the basis to select the touring teams for the Western Suns team at the Interstate Championships and the National Super Surf teams league held in NSW at Maroubra beach. In total we had 9 athletes selected across these carnivals. In addition, 8 Trigg athletes took the opportunity to travel to Manly / Freshwater, NSW to compete in the spectacle that is the annual Australia Day surf carnivals. Unfortunately, after being cancelled the previous season due to Covid, this season it was the presence of a shark which caused the Manly carnival to be cancelled.

Following this hive of activity across December / January, we rolled into the first of the championship events for the season, the Rescue Championships hosted by our club held on 11/2/23. Trigg performed very well at this carnival setting us up for the overall championship club. This was closely followed by the standalone Beach Championships for Nippers/Open/Master on 4/3/23, again held at Trigg, where we had our best turnout ever of representative athletes with numerous medals won and just as importantly 95 valuable points to go towards our overall campaign.

On the same weekend, Trigg's master athletes did themselves and the club proud by rallying as a team by reclaiming the Master's State Championships and winning a large number of medals across all age divisions. The following weekend was the turn of our open athletes to try and bring it home for yet another year. In what was one of the most hotly contested Senior State Championships in the last decade, Trigg won by a narrow 44 points in a tightly contested event with North Cottesloe. Our medal count was 44 Gold, 35 Silver and 31 Bronze medals. However, it really was a huge team effort with 86 points coming from 5th and 6th place, and without those points, we would not have defended our title.

We then rolled into the Australian Surf Championships "the Aussies" which Trigg Island SLSC jointly hosted with Scarborough SLSC. The feedback received from everyone who competed at Trigg Beach in the beach, lifesaver and surfing events was fantastic, notwithstanding the lack of waves made it very difficult to hosting the surfing events! Full credit goes to Norm, Marie and Bronwyn and their team of assistants, and all officials and helpers for ensuring that Trigg Island delivered on our hosting responsibilities.

Across the nine days of the Aussie Youth and Open Championships, Trigg athletes won 4 Gold, 2 Silver and 3 Bronze medals. What was the most amazing part of these championships were the number of athletes who qualified for Aussie finals. Trigg had over twenty athletes who qualified for individual finals and thirty-five teams who qualified for finals. This is the highest number of finalists ever the club has had at an Australian Youth and Open championships. The Master's continued their winning form setting new records with a total medal haul of 11 Gold, 10 Silver and 9 Bronze and finishing an amazing third place overall out of all the clubs in Australia at the Australian Master Championships. A big thank you to everyone who assisted in coaching, official duties, water safety, tent set-up/pack-up, the parents and supporters, and the athletes who represented themselves and our club exceptionally well. In particular, thanks to the Youth Team Manager Mike Boisvert, the Master's Manager Mark Doick, the Open Team Manager Tracey Metcalf and all their respective assistants.

Notes to the Financial Statements

The financial statements cover Trigg Island Surf Life Saving Club Inc as an individual entity. Trigg Island Surf Life Saving Club Inc is a not-for-profit Association incorporated in Western Australia under the *Associations Incorporation Act (WA) 2015* ('the Act').

The principal activities of the Association for the year ended 30 April 2023 were:

- Provision of weekend patrols on our beach in delivering an essential lifesaving service;
- Provision of training courses to enhance the skills of our members; and
- Participate in Surf Sports events, locally, interstate and internationally.

The functional and presentation currency of Trigg Island Surf Life Saving Club Inc is

Australian dollars. The financial report was authorised for issue by the Committee of

Management on 14th June 2023 Comparatives are consistent with prior years, unless

otherwise stated.

1 Basis of Preparation

The financial statements are general purpose financial statements that have been prepared in accordance with the Australian Accounting Standards – Reduced Disclosure Regime and the Act.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities.

The accounting policies set out below have been consistently applied to all years presented.

2 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

(a) Income Tax

The Association is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997*.

(b) Leases

For any new contracts entered into on or after 1 January 2019, the Association considers whether a contract is, or contains a lease. A lease is defined as 'a contract, or part of a contract, that conveys the right to use an asset (the underlying asset) for a period of time in exchange for consideration'. To apply this definition the Association assesses whether the contract meets three key evaluations which are whether:

- the contract contains an identified asset, which is either explicitly identified in the contract or implicitly specified by being identified at the time the asset is made available to the Association
- the Association has the right to obtain substantially all of the economic benefits from use of the identified asset throughout the period of use, considering its rights within the defined scope of the contract

The Association has the right to direct the use of the identified asset throughout the period of use. The Association assess whether it has the right to direct 'how and for what purpose' the asset is used throughout the period of use.

(b) Leases (cont.)

At lease commencement date, the Association recognises a right-of-use asset and a lease liability on the balance sheet. The right-of-use asset is measured at cost, which is made up of the initial measurement of the lease liability, any initial direct costs incurred by the Association, an estimate of any costs to dismantle and remove the asset at the end of the lease, and any lease payments made in advance of the lease commencement date (net of any incentives received).

The Association depreciates the right-of-use assets on a straight-line basis from the lease commencement date to the earlier of the end of the useful life of the right-of-use asset or the end of the lease term.

The Association also assesses the right-of-use asset for impairment when such indicators exist.

At the commencement date, the Association measures the lease liability at the present value of the lease payments unpaid at that date, discounted using the interest rate implicit in the lease if that rate is readily available or the Association's incremental borrowing rate.

Lease payments included in the measurement of the lease liability are made up of fixed payments (including in substance fixed), variable payments based on an index or rate, amounts expected to be payable under a residual value guarantee and payments arising from options reasonably certain to be exercised.

Subsequent to initial measurement, the liability will be reduced for payments made and increased for interest. It is remeasured to reflect any reassessment or modification, or if there are changes in in-substance fixed payments.

(c) Revenue and other income

Revenue is recognised when the amount of the revenue can be measured reliably, it is probable that economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the Association and specific criteria relating to the type of revenue as noted below, has been satisfied.

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable and is presented net of returns, discounts and rebates.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

Sale of goods

Revenue is recognised on transfer of goods to the customer as this is deemed to be the point in time when risks and rewards are transferred and there is no longer any ownership or effective control over the goods.

Grant revenue

Grant revenue is recognised in the statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income when the entity obtains control of the grant, it is probable that the economic benefits gained from the grant will flow to the entity and the amount of the grant can be measured reliably.

When grant revenue is received whereby the entity incurs an obligation to deliver economic value directly back to the contributor, this is considered a reciprocal transaction and the grant revenue is recognised in the statement of financial position as a liability until the service has been delivered to the contributor, otherwise the grant is recognised as income on receipt

(c) Revenue and other income (cont.)

Trigg Island Surf Life Saving Club Inc receives non-reciprocal contributions of assets from the government and other parties for zero or a nominal value. These assets are recognised at fair value on the date of acquisition in the statement of financial position, with a corresponding amount of income recognised in the statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income.

Donations

Donations and bequests are recognised as revenue when received.

Interest revenue

Interest is recognised using the effective interest method.

Rendering of services

Revenue in relation to rendering of services is recognised depending on whether the outcome of the services can be estimated reliably. If the outcome can be estimated reliably then the stage of completion of the services is used to determine the appropriate level of revenue to be recognised in the period.

If the outcome cannot be reliably estimated, then revenue is recognised to the extent of expenses recognised that are recoverable.

The core principle of AASB 15 is that revenue is recognised on a basis that reflects the transfer of promised goods or services to customers at an amount that reflects the consideration the Company expects to receive in exchange for those goods or services.

1. Revenue is recognised by applying a five-step model as follows:
2. Identify the contract with the customer
3. Identify the performance obligations
4. Determine the transaction price
5. Allocate the transaction price to the performance obligations

Recognise revenue as and when control of the performance obligations is transferred

(c) Revenue and other income

Gain on disposal of non-current assets

When a non-current asset is disposed, the gain or loss is calculated by comparing proceeds received with its carrying amount and is taken to profit or loss.

Other income

Other income is recognised on an accruals basis when the Association is entitled to it.

(d) Borrowing costs

Borrowing costs that are directly attributable to the acquisition, construction or production of a qualifying asset are capitalised as part of the cost of that asset.

All other borrowing costs are recognised as an expense in the period in which they are incurred.

(e) Goods and services tax (GST)

Revenue, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payable are stated inclusive of GST.

The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included as part of receivables or payables in the statement of financial position.

Cash flows in the statement of cash flows are included on a gross basis and the GST component of cash flows arising from investing and financing activities which is recoverable from, or payable to, the taxation authority is classified as operating cash flows.

(f) Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Inventories acquired at no cost, or for nominal consideration are valued at the current replacement cost as at the date of acquisition, which is the deemed cost.

(g) Property, plant and equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment.

Items of property, plant and equipment acquired for nil or nominal consideration have been recorded at the acquisition date fair value.

(g) Property, plant and equipment

Where the cost model is used, the asset is carried at its cost less any accumulated depreciation and any impairment losses. Costs include purchase price, other directly attributable costs and the initial estimate of the costs of dismantling and restoring the asset, where applicable.

Assets measured using the revaluation model are carried at fair value at the revaluation date less any subsequent accumulated depreciation and impairment losses. Revaluations are performed whenever there is a material movement in the value of an asset under the revaluation model.

Plant and equipment

Plant and equipment are measured using the revaluation model. Motor vehicles are recognised at their net or trade in value.

Depreciation

Property, plant and equipment, excluding freehold land, is depreciated on a straight-line basis over the asset's useful life to the Association, commencing when the asset is ready for use.

Leased assets and leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or their estimated useful life.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable asset are shown below:

Fixed asset class	Depreciation rate
Furniture, Fixtures and Fittings	5% - 20%
Competition Equipment	10%-20%
Leasehold improvements	5% - 20%

At the end of each annual reporting period, the depreciation method, useful life and residual value of each asset is reviewed. Any revisions are accounted for prospectively as a change in estimate.

(h) Financial instruments

Financial instruments are recognised initially using trade date accounting, i.e., on the date that the Association becomes party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

On initial recognition, all financial instruments are measured at fair value plus transaction costs (except for instruments measured at fair value through profit or loss where transaction costs are expensed as incurred).

Financial Assets

Financial assets are divided into the following categories which are described in detail below:

- loans and receivables;

(h) Financial instruments

Financial assets are assigned to the different categories on initial recognition, depending on the characteristics of the instrument and its purpose. A financial instrument's category is relevant to the way it is measured and whether any resulting income and expenses are recognised in profit or loss or in other comprehensive income.

All income and expenses relating to financial assets are recognised in the statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income in the 'finance income' or 'finance costs' line item respectively.

Loans and receivables

Loans and receivables are non-derivative financial assets with fixed or determinable payments that are not quoted in an active market. They arise principally through the provision of goods and services to customers but also incorporate other types of contractual monetary assets.

After initial recognition these are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less provision for impairment. Any change in their value is recognised in profit or loss.

The Association's trade and other receivables fall into this category of financial instruments.

Significant receivables are considered for impairment on an individual asset basis when they are past due at the reporting date or when objective evidence is received that a specific counterparty will default.

The amount of the impairment is the difference between the net carrying amount and the present value of the future expected cash flows associated with the impaired receivable.

In some circumstances, the Association renegotiates repayment terms with customers which may lead to changes in the timing of the payments, the Association does not necessarily consider the balance to be impaired, however assessment is made on a case-by-case basis.

Any gain or loss arising from derivative financial instruments is based on changes in fair value, which is determined by direct reference to active market transactions or using a valuation technique where no active market exists.

Financial liabilities

Financial liabilities are classified as either financial liabilities 'at fair value through profit or losses or other financial liabilities depending on the purpose for which the liability was acquired. Although the Association uses derivative financial instruments in economic hedges of currency and interest rate risk, it does not hedge account for these transactions.

The Association's financial liabilities include borrowings, trade and other payables (including finance lease liabilities), which are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest rate method.

Impairment of financial assets

At the end of the reporting period the Association assesses whether there is any objective evidence that a financial asset or group of financial assets is impaired.

(i) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash on hand, demand deposits and short-term investments which are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

Bank overdrafts also form part of cash equivalents for the purpose of the statement of cash flows and are presented within current liabilities on the statement of financial position.

(j) Employee benefits

Provision is made for the Association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee benefits that are expected to be wholly settled within one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

3 Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgments

The directors make estimates and judgements during the preparation of these financial statements regarding assumptions about current and future events affecting transactions and balances.

These estimates and judgements are based on the best information available at the time of preparing the financial statements, however as additional information is known then the actual results may differ from the estimates.

The significant estimates and judgements made have been described below.

Key estimates - receivables

The receivables at reporting date have been reviewed to determine whether there is any objective evidence that any of the receivables are impaired. An impairment provision is included for any receivable where the entire balance is not considered collectible. No impairment exists in the current financial period.

Key estimates - inventory

Each item on inventory is reviewed on an annual basis to determine whether it is being carried at higher than its net realisable value. During the year, management have written down inventory based on best estimate of the net realisable value, although until the time that inventory is sold this is an estimate.


