ITEM 3 – Receipt and Adoption of the 2023/24 Annual Report and Financial Statements

3.1 The President presented the Annual Report, asked the meeting if there were any questions to any Directors.

3.2 Financial Report – Hayden Marchetto presented the financial report
Throughout the season we've remained committed to the ongoing success and sustainability of the club
Revenue decreased by 8.17% while expenses increased by 7.33%, mainly due the rise of costs of doing business
Our cash flow statement reveals a net cash outflow of \$27,033 this year, compared to a positive inflow last year. This change primarily reflects increased payments for operational and community activities, alongside investments in our facilities.

Financial Ratios:

- Liquidity – despite a decrease, our current ration remains strong, indicating our ability to meet short-term obligations
- Profitability – the net profit margin decreased highlighting higher expenses relative to revenue.
- Efficiency – the asset turnover ratio slightly decreased, indicating a marginal reduction in how efficiently we use assets to generate revenue.
- Solvency – the debit-to-equity ratio remains low, showing minimal reliance on debt financing.

Despite financial challenges, we're focused on investing in our club's future.

Our Nippers are our future and we need to harness their respective talents in all areas of the club.

Trigg has the best Youth program in the state without a shadow of a doubt and that is due to the leadership of Mike Boisvert. Humming away in the background, Mike has a great team of supporters willing to pitch in and get things done. Trigg dominates the podium at the Youth Leadership Awards, a fact that make me so proud for these young people are our future.

Surf Sports gets a lot of acclaim for the amazing dedication of our athletes and we have had a stellar season in 2024/25. Trigg has been well represented in State Teams, State Titles and Australian Titles with competitors and medal winners putting their hearts and souls on the line, not just in the summer season, but in winter in IRB’s and Pool Rescue. I thank Pete for his assistance, integrity and teamwork over the time on the Board. Pail Burton joined the Board this season as a Special Director. Tasked with assisting us to become more professional, more efficient, and better as a Club, Paul has brought a wealth of knowledge from the corporate world into the Trigg boardroom, also assisting with Sponsorship, a buddy system, and recently on the employment of new staff in what is an exciting time for us as a club.

Some of my highlights from this year include:

- Assisting the Breast Cancer Research Centre raise over \$10 000 with our water safety assistance.
- Finalising a long-term redevelopment plan for new facilities and surrounds. We now need the City's assistance and hopefully funding in the next election cycle.
- Securing a \$300 000 grant from the WA State Government for a short-term revamp of our admin areas and western facing alfresco area. This should get underway very shortly.
- We have had continued growth in Silver Salties action and a recent \$10 000 grant from the City of Stirling will ensure its continuation into the future.
- Our surf safety program has gone from strength to strength with the addition of a school holiday refugee swimming program with 7 swimming lessons and 2 surf safety sessions run by our Youth. Some of these kids had never been in a pool before let alone a beach and it was fantastic to see the joy and confidence on their faces by the end of the program.
- Finally, a staff restructure has seen two new employees come into the fold at Trigg which we hope will allow us to continue to go from strength to strength.

It is not possible to finish my report without farewelling our great Administrator Bronwyn Meldrum. Bron has been the face of the club for over 12 years and has worked tirelessly to ensure her role is done to perfection each and every day. Bron has filled many voids, whenever needed and without being asked. Her dedication and selfless attitude have ensured the successful running of this club. Bron, we wish you all the best at SLSWA, we will miss you but know you will be around the club (without keys!!) supporting your surf family.

Although not a farewell, but a see you after the baby, Amber is also taking a break from Trigg to concentrate on being a new mum. 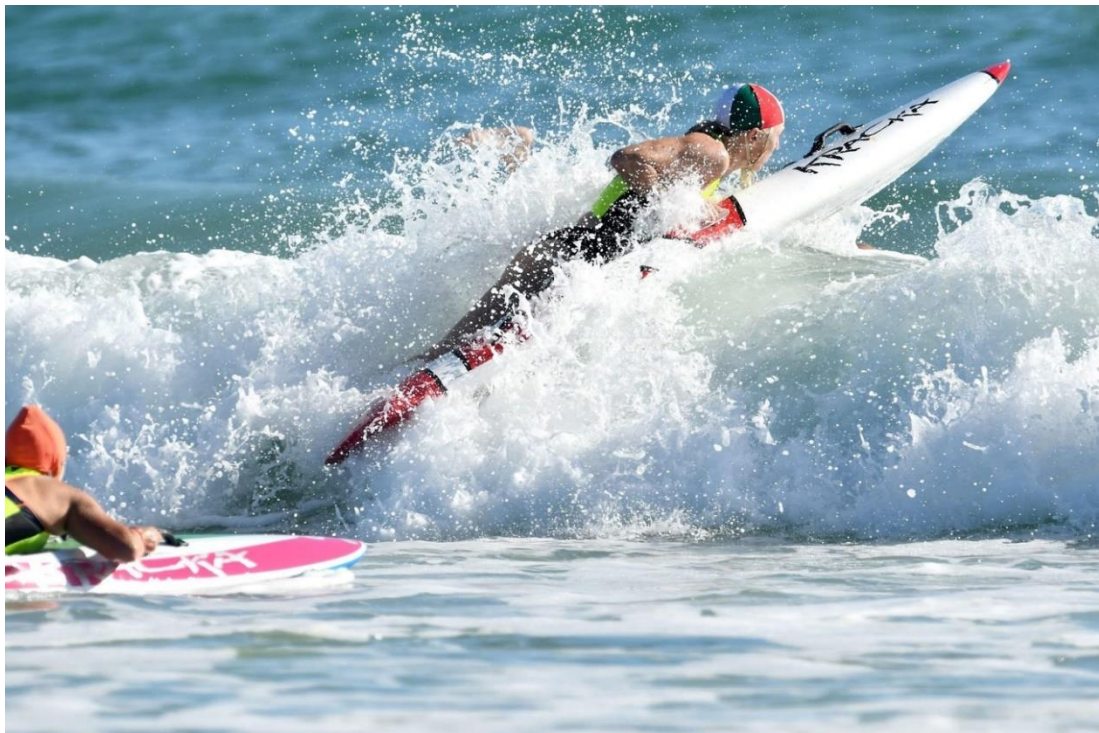

Finance Report – Trigg Island SLSC (FY Ended 30 April 2025)

Overview

The 2025 financial year reflected a period of consolidation and strategic investment as we sought to ensure long-term sustainability while continuing to support our core services. While we recorded a net loss of \$82,855 (improved from the \$112,831 loss in 2024), this result includes investment in staffing, club infrastructure, and community engagement. These were deliberate decisions aligned with the club's evolving operational needs.

Income

Total income grew by 12.2% to \$823,680, with strong performances across:

- Membership fees – steady at \$179,397, highlighting continued engagement.
- Sponsorship and grants – rose to \$171,004, reflecting renewed partnerships and grant success.
- Commercial trading – increased to \$237,887 (+6.9%) from food, bar and merchandise sales.
- Other income – including venue hire, programs and events, more than doubled to \$188,600, showcasing our commercial capability.
- Fundraising and donations – increased by 3.7%, supporting our community-driven model.

Expenses

Total expenses increased by 7.3% to \$781,025 in FY25. This uplift reflects a conscious investment in areas that support the club's operational growth, reduce the administrative burden on volunteers, and improve long-term sustainability.

- Appointment of a General Manager and support roles in administration and marketing enabled better member engagement, venue operations, and revenue development.
- Higher costs in utilities, insurance, and cleaning were aligned with increased building use and expanded club activities.
- Program delivery led to increased spending in youth, community programs, and surf sports ensuring we maintained a high standard of service and inclusivity.

While expenditure rose, it was aligned with strategic priorities and supported by growth in non-member income sources, allowing the club to absorb these costs.

Cash flow & balance sheet

Despite the reported loss, our cash flow remained strong:

- Operating activities yielded a net cash inflow of \$36,422, a turnaround from a \$27,033 outflow in 2024.
- Investing activities saw \$38,726 reinvested into plant and equipment.

- Cash on hand ended at \$410,514, supporting future sustainability.
- Net assets of \$1.05 million, with total liabilities low at \$63k.

Income Statement vs Cash Flow Statement

It is important to note the distinction between the income statement and the cash flow statement. For Trigg Island SLSC, the cash flow statement provides a more accurate reflection of financial health than the income statement. While the income statement shows whether the club made an accounting profit or loss, it includes non-cash items like depreciation and income not yet received. This means it can paint an overly optimistic or pessimistic picture depending on timing and accounting treatments. For example, in FY2025, the club reported a net loss, but this didn't reflect the actual cash available to run programs or pay expenses.

In contrast, the cash flow statement shows the real movement of money in and out of the club, making it a better tool for assessing liquidity and sustainability. It reveals whether Trigg can cover its day-to-day costs, fund new initiatives, and remain financially stable. In 2025, despite the reported loss, the club ended the year with a positive operating cash flow - a strong indicator that we are managing our resources responsibly. This distinction is key in understanding the club's financial position beyond the bottom line.

Our people

The club has invested in operational capacity, including a GM, admin support, and paid coaching roles.

These changes are part of a longer-term strategy to:

- Support growing program delivery and compliance obligations
- Enhance volunteer experience by reducing administrative burden
- Increase grant success, commercial revenue and community visibility

Sustaining other income - the rise in "other income" is linked to:

- Venue and equipment hire
- Program revenue
- Community event delivery

We are actively developing partnerships, renewing commercial hire agreements, and exploring new funding opportunities to maintain this trajectory.

Future cost pressures & priorities - the Board recognises that careful monitoring of costs is essential. Our 2025-2026 budget will focus on:

- Maintaining lifesaving and training as our core priority
- Exploring grant renewals to sustain community roles
- Containing discretionary spending in areas like merchandise and non-core events

Conclusion

This past year has been one of transition and future-focused investment. We've taken deliberate steps to strengthen our operational base, evolve our service delivery, and position Trigg Island SLSC for sustained success.

We acknowledge the valuable contributions of Bronwyn Meldrum and Sam Starr, who have moved on to pursue new opportunities. Both played pivotal roles in shaping our operations and community impact, and we thank them sincerely for their service. We also recognise Amber Merritt, currently on leave - her creative leadership has elevated the club's profile and will continue to influence our communications approach well into the future.

As part of our evolution, we welcomed Chris Beech into the newly established role of General Manager, bringing leadership and operational expertise to support the club's growing scale and complexity. We also welcomed Sara Dougall as our new Member and Community Administration, ensuring continuity in member service and front-of-house support. Both have settled in strongly and are already contributing to a more streamlined, professional club environment.

We extend our thanks to SLSWA for its continued financial and operational support, and to the City of Stirling for their generous annual grant - both are vital to our capacity to serve our members and community.

To our volunteers, board members, and broader membership - thank you. Your commitment underpins everything we do. In particular, we acknowledge Peter Savage, who steps down from the board after years of dedicated service. Peter has been a steady, principled voice who always put the interests of members first.

At Trigg, we are driven by a deep belief in service, belonging, and the power of community. We exist to save lives, to include everyone, and to create a place where every member feels they matter. That's our 'why' - and it guides everything we do, in and out of the water.

Director of Lifesaving

Under the season 24/25 service agreement with the City of Stirling we provided patrols for Trigg Beach from Saturday October 5th, 2024, to Sunday March 30th on weekends and public holidays amounting to 115 rostered patrols provided by 15 patrol teams and the voluntary AM patrols of Christmas day and New Year's Day.

In addition, we provided 4 Abalone patrols across the 4 abalone fishing season dates.

Prior to the commencement of patrols, we again allocated members to patrol teams as they re-enrolled or gained new qualifications with a view to maintaining consistency for patrol membership balanced against requests based on friendship and family groups. While we were not always to accommodate everyone's requests, on the whole, a balance was achieved. James and Bronwyn put in a lot of time initially to work out teams at the beginning of the season and the youth team were able to provide insight into the best groupings for new SRC award holders as the education team completed courses through the season. We also responded to a handful of requests for members to change patrols for various personal and work reasons.

Patrol Teams

This season we were fortunate again that the majority of patrol captains and vice captains continued in their roles providing stability to the lifesaving area.

We also welcomed some new Patrol Captains who were supported by experienced patrol teams and/or assisted by experienced patrol captains. We are fortunate that we continue to have a lot of diversity in our patrol leadership group with a spread of ages, gender and experience.

Voluntary attendance patrols

This year our calendar we again included a second voluntary attendance patrol on the morning of January 1st coined the "President's Patrol" captained by President Cas Ryan.

Special thanks to all those that attended both Christmas day AM patrols as well as the New Year's Day AM President's patrol.

Abalone

In addition to our standard beach patrols, Trigg contributed patrols to each of the four abalone season days.

Trigg Island SLSC provided up to 4 IRBs with drivers and crews, 2 x Jet skis with operators, land-based patrols, first aid capabilities and coordination in our zone which extended from Trigg Island to north of Bailey Street. Swanbourne Nedlands Surf Club again provided additional land-based personnel to this zone, extending our capabilities and experience.

Members gained valuable experience operating in and around the reefs to the north of Trigg Island.

John Rhatigan performed the roll of Land Zone coordinator and recruited members to assist with land-based activities for 3 patrols and Kevin Edwards took care of the role on 1 occasion.

Justin Meldrum assembled equipment and operators and crew for the water-based patrols.

SLSWA topped up our supplies of PPE in the form of booties and gloves where required for operations on the reefs and also provided more throw lines to assist in reef rescues. The state government funds SLSWA to provide water safety for the season days and Trigg Island SLSC received a share of that based on the resources that we provided.

Our members were involved in 2 rescues but generally were able to focus on preventative actions and a handful of first aid cases.

Equipment

This season we took delivery of a new Jet Ski. We had previously had a second ski on loan from SLSWA. The skis are provided by SLSWA with cost of maintenance sharing agreement in place.

We also took delivery of a new ATV in part thanks to sponsor B&E Fire Protection and at a heavy discount due to a SLSA program. One of the old ATVs was retired and sold.

RWC

A roster operated across the season providing RWC support to the majority of morning patrols and some afternoon patrols. RWCs also operated in water safety roles for carnivals. We continue to have the use of 2 RWCs allowing us to provide multiple RWCs when required, for instance during abalone patrols where we were able to provide 2 RWCs with driver and crew in addition to multiple IRBs.

IRBs

This season we have had a surge of IRB drivers becoming available due to the thriving IRB racing team. This has taken the pressure off what was becoming a weekly task of finding sufficient drivers for rostered patrols.

Patrol Statistics

In the 2024/25 season we provided 115 rostered patrols comprised of members amounting to 6200 hours which is on a par with previous years of similar length seasons. An additional 191.5 hours were provided as abalone patrols.

215 rescues were recorded this season, up from the previous seasons largely due to multiple fine and warm days early in the season coinciding with larger swells. Powercraft performed the majority of rescues with boards mostly involved in the rest.

Preventative actions are also significantly up showing how hard our patrols were working to keep the public safe.

264 first aids were performed, up further from last season but mostly marine stings and minor cuts and abrasions. Fortunately, there were no drownings, no use of defibrillators and only 3 required ambulances and 3 advised to seek further medical attention. This points to the competency and timeliness of the rescues performed and water observation.

It is also noted that club members performed notable rescues out of normal patrol activities on multiple when teams were training and conditions were particularly testing. It is also notable that a member was a first responder to an incident involving an aircraft at Rottnest.

Of the 254 members who patrolled this season, 10% are Long Service or Life Members.

I'd like to take this opportunity to publicly thank everyone who contributed to this season. Including my immediate team, James, Justin and Dave.

Thanks to all the Patrol Captains and Vice Captains, The ARTs and first aid volunteers.

Thanks to the IRB drivers and crews - drivers in particular as they are regularly asked to shoulder more than their fair share of the heavy lifting.

Also, thanks to all the bronze and SRC award holders who make up the rank and file of our capabilities.

There is also an army of almost invisible members that quietly go about their business behind the scenes during the week, making sure that everything keeps ticking along for the following weekend that I would like to thank.

I'd also like to acknowledge that none of this would be possible without Bron and the admin team, the education team and of course our sponsors.

Director of Education

The 2024/25 season has been a period of strong growth, innovation and consolidation across the education portfolio. Our training and assessment team continues to play a critical role in developing capability across all areas of the club, with a focus on building capacity, improving accessibility, and fostering future leadership.

A key achievement this season has been the progression of a number of members into training officer roles following completion of their qualifications. The number of youth trainers now active within the club is particularly promising, reflecting a strong pipeline for future development and leadership within our education and training pathways.

We achieved a notable increase in the number of members holding First Aid and Advanced Resuscitation Techniques (ART) awards, significantly boosting the medical readiness of our patrol teams. Complementing this, we delivered 11 award skills maintenance sessions throughout the season to accommodate the increasing demands on members' time. The repeat of our 'twilight' skills maintenance sessions proved especially popular, providing flexible access to members balancing other commitments.

Trigg Island Surf Life Saving Club had another incredibly successful surf sports season. The season culminated in outstanding performances at the West Australian State Championships and Australian Championships.

Trigg Island's talent extended beyond the water. Eighteen athletes were selected to represent WA as part of the Wester Suns Ocean/Beach Teams, Pathway Teams, Pool Rescue Team, and WA Super Surf Teams League. This was the highest representation of any WA club. To top it off, two members of the Trigg Island team, Jake Smith and Harrison Hynes, were part of the Australian Lifesaving team. They competed at the recent World Championships on the Gold Coast and played a pivotal role in the Australian team's victory, securing the overall point score and becoming World Champions.

Throughout the season, Trigg Island Surf Life Saving Club also hosted or organised seven SLSWA Surf Sport Events. This was the highest number of events held by any WA club, including Coaching Workshops, Surf Leagues, Senior and Nipper carnivals, IRB Championships, and Beach Championships.

Hosting the Nipper State Championships at our home beach is a great honour for our competitors. It also demonstrates our trustworthiness as a host for SLSWA events. These carnivals are only possible thanks to our amazing and reliable volunteers. I want to give a special thanks to Brian (Boots) Campbell, the heart and soul of the club. He ensures that these carnivals run smoothly and perfectly.

As we conclude another phenomenal season, I'm thrilled to reflect on the extraordinary period of competition, achievement, and club spirit at Trigg Island Surf Life Saving Club. The 2024/25 season has truly solidified our reputation in Surf Life Saving.

The Championships were not only a showcase of elite talent and determination but also a celebration of the City of Perth SLSC's 100th anniversary. This milestone event added a special significance to the weekend. The conditions were challenging, with a testing shore break that tested even the most experienced competitors. However, our athletes rose to the occasion, displaying skill, grit, and teamwork throughout.

The weekend prior, Trigg Island proudly hosted the Beach and Nipper Championships. Our "beachies" turned in an outstanding performance. The depth and energy of our squad continue to grow, and it's exciting to see the foundation being laid for future success.

Our overall performance at the State Championships was nothing short of remarkable. Trigg Island finished with an incredible **123 medals – 51 Gold, 41 Silver, and 31 Bronze** – and amassed more championship points than any other club. We won the **Surf and Rescue Championships** and finished **third in the Beach Championship**. While we didn't win the overall championship this year, full credit and congratulations go to Sorrento SLSC for their strong showing.

We would like to express our deepest gratitude to all our coaches for their tireless efforts throughout the season. **Andrew Mosel, in particular, deserves special recognition** for his unwavering dedication to both coaching and meticulous team selection. Your expertise was instrumental in our remarkable success, and our results are a testament to the strength of your leadership.

We also want to thank Todd Brewer, Reece Baker, and Troy Baird for their exceptional ski coaching. Dave Motteram played a vital role in developing and youth board coaching, while Darren Rogers provided invaluable beach sprint training. Norm and Carol Gibbs, who coached the March Past, and R&R, also deserve our gratitude. Other coaches to thank are Darryl O'Donnell (R&R), Paige Stegmann (Champion Lifesaver), Kate Mosel (Masters), Rod Bennet (Boats), Adam Yeo (IRB). Also, thanks to the captains - Pat Harris (Ski), Mark Doick (Board), Di Doick (Masters)

Throughout the season, we hosted several carnivals that provided opportunities for our athletes to showcase their skills and compete against other teams.

This season, we witnessed some truly **outstanding individual performances**. **Annika Negus** emerged as the *Mike Cook Trophy winner*, securing 12 gold medals and 5 individual golds. **Eleanor Flowers** also had an impressive season, winning 8 gold medals, including 4 individual golds. **Sam Brigden, Olly Browne, Billy Hawks, Milly Kok, Trent Yates, and Ellie Neervoort** all contributed to the team's success by winning 8, 7, 6, 4, 4, and 4 gold medals, respectively.

On the water, the boats continued to attract new rowers, and the team is actively working to establish regular crews that can compete at a high level.

Under the guidance of Adam Yeo, our IRB team has experienced significant growth and has achieved remarkable results at the State Championship and local events.

The Aussies was held at North Kirra, where Queensland's typical weather of rain, humidity, and sunshine prevailed. Over 40 individuals and 30 Trigg Teams made it to the Aussie finals, resulting in a combined medal count of 14 gold, 7 silver, and 9 bronze medals across the Youth, Masters, and Open competitions.

Celebrating a Year of Growth, Learning, and Fun

Introduction

The Nippers program at Trigg Surf Life Saving Club is recognised along the Western Australian coast as a powerhouse in producing robust competitors and future life savers. The Nipper program thrives on fun, developing confidence in difficult conditions, camaraderie and volunteering. A significant focus for the program this year was a combination of facilitating fun and encouraging volunteering.

Prior to addressing the 2024-2025 season I would like to pay homage to Kevin Duguid who held the role of Director of Nippers for the previous six years. Kevin facilitated a period of unprecedented growth in the Nipper program and having performed the role for one season I am in awe of his contribution.

Season focus

Our season commenced with Registration Day, where we shared general information about the season and welcomed Troy Kirkham, CEO of SportWest and Churchill Scholarship recipient to talk about his work on youth retention in sport. Troy's key messages were kids play sport for fun, they keep playing because their mates play and winning is significantly less important to keep them involved. We saw this principle reinforced throughout the season where our Nippers gained in confidence by simply outperforming their own expectations.

Troy's message is critical in the context of the small decline in participation, with a 6% decrease in enrolments with a total of 407 Nippers in the 2024-2025 season. The Nipper Committee is deeply committed to addressing this decline by making the Trigg Nipper program the most engaged, fun and successful on the coast.

Life @ Trigg

Throughout the season, the Nipper Committee coordinated a series of "showcase" events with "non-Nipper" parts of the club. The intention was to show our Nippers the "why" we do what we do. Showcase events included:

- March past demonstration – U23 Aussie Gold Medallists
- IRB rescue / racing demonstration
- "Power of the Rip" demonstration
- Surf boat delivering Santa on Christmas Day
- Interface with Water Police with some very fortunate Nippers having the opportunity to have a ride.

These events were made possible by volunteers drawn from a broad range of club areas and we are eternally grateful for the support!

U13 Leadership Camp

At the beginning of the season, Trigg offers a residential U13 Development Camp at Ern Halliday Camp for a whole weekend. The Camp provides an opportunity for the U13 group to bond closely before their season as leaders.

At this year's camp the U13's were treated to a leadership activity facilitated by Broch Cleminson, a professional leadership consultant where they had to work in teams to build a bridge with the strength to sustain a Tonka truck. Despite wildly different approaches all teams were successful.

Justin Brent-White from Ocean Built delivered a presentation on board design and manufacture. The U13's came away from this presentation with a better understanding of board care and maintenance. They also had a chance to design a Trigg board – the end result is the Watermelon board that you may have seen on the beach. The U13 camp should be thought of as a must as it offers so much value.

U13's also had an opportunity to hear from our Youth leaders about the transition from Nippers to Youth, participate in rope courses and of course, spent time at the beach.

Surf Sports

Our surf sports season included the following carnivals:

- 30th November 2024 – Little Nippers (Cottesloe).
- 1st December 2024 – Nippers Carnival (Coogee).
- 11th January 2025 – Little Nippers (Quinns Mindarie).
- 12th January 2025 – Nippers (Trigg Island).
- 25-26th January 2025 – Country Carnival (Bunbury).
- 2nd February 2025 – Club championships (Trigg Island).
- 8-9th February 2025 – Metro Qualifier Carnival (Fremantle).
- 23rd February 2025 – Little Nipper State Champs (Fremantle).
- 1st March 2025 – Nipper Beach States (Trigg Island).
- 2-3rd March 2025 – Nipper Water States (Trigg Island).

Involvement in surf sports is an integral part of becoming a great life saver. Our Nippers who train to compete spend the most time on the water and as a result increase their competence. Throughout the season, Trigg offers a minimum of three training sessions per week. Our regular coaches including Sascha Innocent (Tuesday) and Adam Yeo (Thursday/Saturday) provide opportunities to train throughout the season. Trigg would love to see these sessions oversubscribed to the point we have to find more coaches!

Trigg Island achieved 6th place at the WA Nipper State Championships which is lower than our aspirations. We would love to see more Nippers training, competing and having fun in the process next season.

To support our existing coaches, we introduced a "Super Saturday" training session later in the season. The intent of Super Saturday was to invite high performance athletes who may not be able to commit to regular sessions to inject some fresh enthusiasm into the squad. In short – it worked. We saw a bump in numbers and fun was off the charts.

Moving forward, it is important for all involved in Nippers to be aware that coaches are rarely the limiting factor for Nipper water sessions (the club is full of legends), it is our requirement to have a 1-5 water safety ratio. Therefore, we need our parent members to gain a qualification and pull on the orange vests to super-size our sessions.

Parent Engagement

In the early planning stages of the season, a membership working group was established which recognised an area for opportunity is increased engagement with our parent members. Early in the season, we played a simple “name game” with the parents from each age group. It quickly became apparent that some parent members had been involved with Trigg for some time without learning the names of other parents in the own age group. After playing the game, the groups agreed (with a smile) that it’s ok to ask someone their name 1000 times until you remember it.

As Director of Nippers, I believe it is fundamental that the parents get to know each other to genuinely feel part of the club and continue to encourage their children to participate on the tough days.

Social Events

In addition to having fun on the beach and water, Trigg actively invested in social events for the Nippers including:

- Crazy hair disco
- 3 x 3 basketball tournament
- Post carnival BBQs.

The intent of these events is to create an opportunity to have fun and create social connections off the beach, but within the club – with an achievable amount of work. Each event was successful in its objective; however, we’d always encourage more members to attend.

Volunteer Contributions

The success of our Nippers program would not be possible without the army of devoted volunteers, including age group managers, water safety personnel, and administrative support teams. This year, over 100 volunteers contributed their time and expertise to ensure every Nipper had a safe and enriching experience. We extend our heartfelt thanks to these individuals for their unwavering support and dedication.

Age Managers are truly incredible, and their commitment goes well beyond the standard community footy coach. The hours each Age Manager devotes to the Nippers each season is extraordinary and often involves unseen tasks. In particular I’d like to highlight our retiring Age Manager, Risma Price who has led an age group for many years with multiple children, as have Adam Yeo, Nick & Mellie Straight. Thanks Risma for the years of service and enjoy having a little more free time.

As previously mentioned, Water Safety is critical and they need to be qualified (or requalified). Jenny Taylor’s efforts to ensure all of our Water Safety are trained cannot be underestimated. Thanks Jenny for your commitment to Nippers and the club.

Our “sea of orange” Water Safety team makes an impression to all beach goers. Our Linfox Junior Water Safety award was attributed to Tim Emmot this year, who has been in the water supporting the Nippers since his son started the program. Tim’s quiet dedication and support represent the very heart of our Water Safety team.



Finally, I’d like to thank the Youth volunteers who joined us after intensive ironman / woman training to support our Nippers in Water Safety and some in-water coaching tips. Our Nippers love your support and guidance. And quite frankly I’m very proud of the club members you’ve become.

Conclusion

The Nippers program at Trigg Surf Life Saving Club continues to thrive as a vital part of our community, educating future generations on the importance of surf safety and teamwork. The achievements of this season reflect the collective effort of Nippers, parents, volunteers, and club members. We are incredibly proud of what has been accomplished and look forward to building upon this success in the years to come.

Unfortunately, due to work commitments I am unable to continue in the Director of Nippers role, however I am confident that the new Director will guide the Nipper program to new heights.

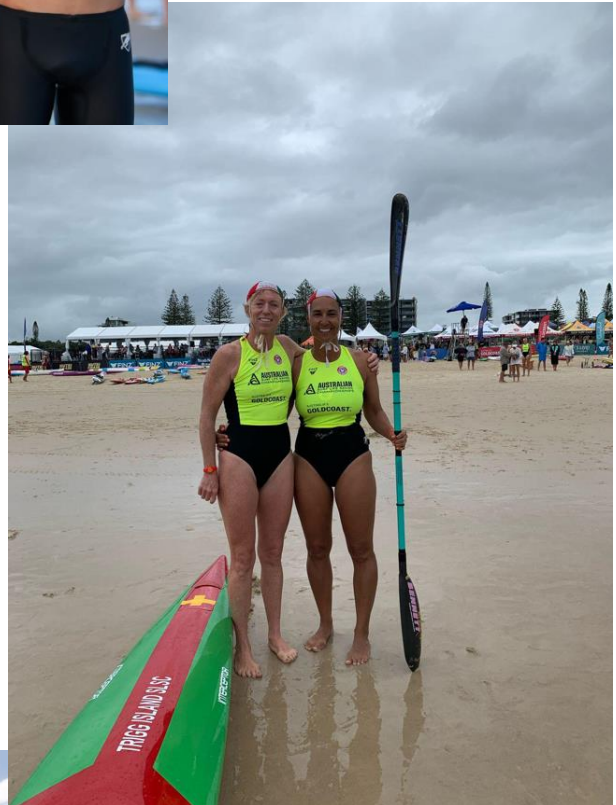

Notes to the Financial Statements For the Year Ended 30 April 2025

The financial statements cover Trigg Island Surf Life Saving Club Inc as an individual entity. Trigg Island Surf Life Saving Club Inc is a not-for-profit Association incorporated in Western Australia under the Associations Incorporation Act (WA) 2015 ('the Act').

The principal activities of the Association for the year ended 30 April 2025 were;

- Provision of weekend patrols on our beach in delivering an essential lifesaving service;
- Provision of training courses to enhance the skills of our members; and
- Participate in Surf Sports events, locally, interstate and internationally.

The functional and presentation currency of Trigg Island Surf Life Saving Club Inc is Australian dollars.

The financial report was authorised for issue by the Committee of Management on 13 June 2025.

Comparatives are consistent with prior years, unless otherwise stated.

1 Basis of Preparation

The financial statements are general purpose financial statements that have been prepared in accordance with the Australian Accounting Standards – Simplified Disclosure and the Act.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities.

The accounting policies set out below have been consistently applied to all years presented.

2 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

(a) Revenue and other income

Revenue is recognised when the amount of the revenue can be measured reliably, it is probable that economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the Association and specific criteria relating to the type of revenue as noted below, has been satisfied.

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable and is presented net of returns, discounts and rebates.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

Sale of goods

Revenue is recognised on transfer of goods to the customer as this is deemed to be the point in time when risks and rewards are transferred and there is no longer any ownership or effective control over the goods.

Grant revenue

Grant revenue is recognised in the statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income when the entity obtains control of the grant, it is probable that the economic benefits gained from the grant

will flow to the entity and the amount of the grant can be measured reliably.

When grant revenue is received whereby the entity incurs an obligation to deliver economic value directly back to the contributor, this is considered a reciprocal transaction and the grant revenue is recognised in the statement of financial position as a liability until the service has been delivered to the contributor, otherwise the grant is recognised as income on receipt

Trigg Island Surf Life Saving Club Inc receives non-reciprocal contributions of assets from the government and other parties for zero or a nominal value. These assets are recognised at fair value on the date of acquisition in the statement of financial position, with a corresponding amount of income recognised in the statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income.

Donations

Donations and bequests are recognised as revenue when received.

Interest revenue

Interest is recognised using the effective interest method.

Rendering of services

Revenue in relation to rendering of services is recognised depending on whether the outcome of the services can be estimated reliably. If the outcome can be estimated reliably then the stage of completion of the services is used to determine the appropriate level of revenue to be recognised in the period.

If the outcome cannot be reliably estimated, then revenue is recognised to the extent of expenses recognised that are recoverable.

The core principle of AASB 15 is that revenue is recognised on a basis that reflects the transfer of promised goods or services to customers at an amount that reflects the consideration the Company expects to receive in exchange for those goods or services.

1. Revenue is recognised by applying a five-step model as follows:
2. Identify the contract with the customer
3. Identify the performance obligations
4. Determine the transaction price
5. Allocate the transaction price to the performance obligations

Recognise revenue as and when control of the performance obligations is transferred

Gain on disposal of non-current assets

(a) Revenue and other income

When a non-current asset is disposed, the gain or loss is calculated by comparing proceeds received with its carrying amount and is taken to profit or loss.

Other income

Other income is recognised on an accruals basis when the Association is entitled to it.

(b) Income Tax

The Association is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997*.

(c) Borrowing costs

Borrowing costs that are directly attributable to the acquisition, construction or production of a qualifying asset are capitalised as part of the cost of that asset.

All other borrowing costs are recognised as an expense in the period in which they are incurred.

(d) Goods and services tax (GST)

Revenue, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payable are stated inclusive of GST. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included as part of receivables or payables in the statement of financial position.

Cash flows in the statement of cash flows are included on a gross basis and the GST component of cash flows arising from investing and financing activities which is recoverable from, or payable to, the taxation authority is classified as operating cash flows.

(e) Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Inventories acquired at no cost, or for nominal consideration are valued at the current replacement cost as at the date of acquisition, which is the deemed cost.

(f) Property, plant and equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment.

Items of property, plant and equipment acquired for significantly less than fair value have been recorded at the acquisition date fair value.

Where the cost model is used, the asset is carried at its cost less any accumulated depreciation and any impairment losses. Costs include purchase price, other directly attributable costs and the initial estimate of the costs of dismantling and restoring the asset, where applicable.

Assets measured using the revaluation model are carried at fair value at the revaluation date less any subsequent accumulated depreciation and impairment losses. Revaluations are performed whenever there is a material movement in the value of an asset under the revaluation model.

Depreciation

Property, plant and equipment, excluding freehold land, is depreciated on a straight-line basis over the asset's useful life to the Association, commencing when the asset is ready for use.

Leased assets and leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or their estimated useful life.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable asset are shown below:

Fixed asset class	Depreciation rate
Furniture, Fixtures and Fittings	5% - 20%
Computer Equipment	10% - 20%
Leasehold improvements	5% - 20%

At the end of each annual reporting period, the depreciation method, useful life and residual value of each asset is reviewed. Any revisions are accounted for prospectively as a change in estimate.

(g) Financial instruments

Financial instruments are recognised initially on the date that the Association becomes party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

On initial recognition, all financial instruments are measured at fair value plus transaction costs (except for instruments measured at fair value through profit or loss where transaction costs are expensed as incurred).

Financial assets

Financial instruments are recognised initially using trade date accounting, i.e. on the date that the Association becomes party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

On initial recognition, all financial instruments are measured at fair value plus transaction costs (except for instruments measured at fair value through profit or loss where transaction costs are expensed as incurred).

characteristics of the instrument and its purpose. A financial instrument's category is relevant to the way it is measured and whether any resulting income and expenses are recognised in profit or loss or in other comprehensive income.

All income and expenses relating to financial assets are recognised in the statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income in the 'finance income' or 'finance costs' line item respectively.

Loans and receivables

Loans and receivables are non-derivative financial assets with fixed or determinable payments that are not quoted in an active market. They arise principally through the provision of goods and services to customers but also incorporate other types of contractual monetary assets.

After initial recognition these are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less provision for impairment. Any change in their value is recognised in profit or loss.

The Association's trade and other receivables fall into this category of financial instruments.

Significant receivables are considered for impairment on an individual asset basis when they are past due at the reporting date or when objective evidence is received that a specific counterparty will default.

The amount of the impairment is the difference between the net carrying amount and the present value of the future expected cash flows associated with the impaired receivable.

In some circumstances, the Association renegotiates repayment terms with customers which may lead to changes in the timing of the payments, the Association does not necessarily consider the balance to be impaired, however assessment is made on a case-by-case basis.

Any gain or loss arising from derivative financial instruments is based on changes in fair value, which is determined by direct reference to active market transactions or using a valuation technique where no active market exists.

Financial liabilities

Financial liabilities are classified as either financial liabilities 'at fair value through profit or losses or other financial liabilities depending on the purpose for which the liability was acquired. Although the Association uses derivative financial instruments in economic hedges of currency and interest rate risk, it does not hedge account for these transactions.

The Association's financial liabilities include borrowings, trade and other payables (including finance lease liabilities), which are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest rate method.

Impairment of financial assets

At the end of the reporting period the Association assesses whether there is any objective evidence that a financial asset or group of financial assets is impaired.

(h) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprises cash on hand, demand deposits and short-term investments which are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

(i) Leases

At the lease commencement, the Association recognises a right-of-use asset and associated lease liability for the lease term. The lease term includes extension periods where the Association believes it is reasonably certain that the option will be exercised.

The right-of-use asset is measured using the cost model where cost on initial recognition comprises of the lease liability, initial direct costs, prepaid lease payments, estimated cost of removal and restoration less any lease incentives received.

The right-of-use asset is depreciated over the lease term on a straight line basis and assessed for impairment in accordance with the impairment of assets accounting policy.

The lease liability is initially measured at the present value of the remaining lease payments at the commencement of the lease. The discount rate is the rate implicit in the lease, however where this cannot be readily determined then the Association's incremental borrowing rate is used.

Subsequent to initial recognition, the lease liability is measured at amortised cost using the effective interest rate method. The lease liability is remeasured whether there is a lease modification, change in estimate of the lease term or index upon which the lease payments are based (e.g. CPI) or a change in the Association's assessment of lease term.

Where the lease liability is remeasured, the right-of-use asset is adjusted to reflect the remeasurement or is recorded in profit or loss if the carrying amount of the right-of-use asset has been reduced to zero.

(j) Employee benefits

Provision is made for the Association's liability for employee benefits, those benefits that are expected to be wholly settled within one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

3 Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgments

The directors make estimates and judgements during the preparation of these financial statements regarding assumptions about current and future events affecting transactions and balances.

These estimates and judgements are based on the best information available at the time of preparing the financial statements, however as additional information is known then the actual results may differ from the estimates.

The significant estimates and judgements made have been described below.

3 Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgments

Key estimates - receivables

The receivables at reporting date have been reviewed to determine whether there is any objective evidence that any of the receivables are impaired. An impairment provision is included for any receivable where the entire balance is not considered collectible. No impairment exists in the current financial period.

Key estimates - inventory

Each item on inventory is reviewed on an annual basis to determine whether it is being carried at higher than its net realisable value. During the year, management have written down inventory based on best estimate of the net realisable value, although until the time that inventory is sold this is an estimate.


